6 'PROPER' CORNISH SAYINGS





"PROPER" (PROPER JOB)

The Cornish people say 'proper' or 'proper' job which can mean a kind of 'well done' and a compliment to your job or a job well done. Proper job is also the name for a real ale from Cornwall which is very nice indeed!

"I'LLITELLYWOT"

Can translate to "Your not going to believe this" and usually followed by some hot gossip of some kind or the latest news.






"ANSOM"

"Ansom" is a well used phase in the Cornish language. This means something is really nice or really tasty. E.g. "This pasty is ansom"



A well known Cornish phase which many up country folk struggle to understand. It means things will be done when they're done. No rush in Cornwall as they enjoy a slower pace of life.



DRECKLY



"AWRIGHT'N AREE"

This means - Are you OK? Or, you are alright, are you? If a Cornish person asks you this they are checking on your wellbeing!

"ULLON YAW!"

This phrase means "wait a minute". Cornish people do not appreciate being rushed which is most probably when this phase is used.
